Thinking of becoming an Australian citizen?

ACL, the largest provider of high quality English language education in Australia, is teaching the Let's Participate citizenship course at its ACL Fairfield and Cabramatta colleges or by Distance Learning.

ACL group managing director Helen Zimmerman said the course is ideal for members of the community who are thinking of becoming Australian citizens.

Students are taught by an experienced teacher and will progress through the workbook using computer-assisted CDs/DVDs.

The course covers such areas as Australia and its people; democratic government in Australia; your rights, responsibilities and privileges as a citizen; law and democracy in Australia; and becoming an Australian citizen.

Upon successful completion AMEP eligible students receive an AMEP Citizenship, Responsibilities and Privilege Record. For AMEP eligible students, the Department of Immigration and Citizenship will not test for this at interview stage in the process of becoming a citizen.
